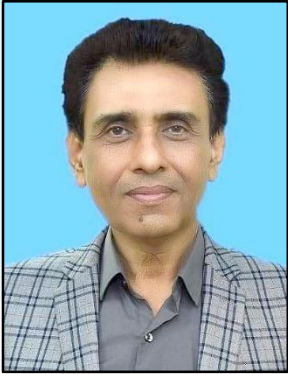

SCHEME OF STUDIES

Grades ECE and I-VIII

GUIDELINES FOR GRADES ECE & I-VIII

1. Annual Academic Calendar: 170-180 total working days in case of 05 days a week, and 210-216 total working days in case of 06 days a week.
2. School time per day may be 5 -5.5 hours for Grade 1onwards. Time allocation for each subject may be decided at an institutional level.
3. Academic session in summer zone areas will start in the first week of April and in Winter Zone in the first week of March.
4. Summer & Winter Vacation announcements are at the discretion of the administrative departments of respective educational institutions.
5. Schools are empowered to divide the textbook content into term-wise.
6. The number of periods per week for double shift schools may be 35 periods and for single schools may be 40 periods or as deemed appropriate by the institutions.
7. Formative and/or Summative Assessment will be carried out as deemed appropriate by the institutions.
8. Nazra Quran will be completed from ECE to Grade V.
9. The translation of the Holy Quran (Grades VI-VIII) as a separate compulsory subject will be assessed in Urdu/English Reference to context questions may be part of the paper or as per practices adopted by the provinces.
10. Medium of instruction is optional i.e. either English or Urdu for subjects i.e. General Knowledge (Grades I-III), Social Studies (Grades IV-V), History (Grade VI-VIII), Geography (Grades VI-VIII), Islamiat (Grades I-XII), Religious Education (Grades I-XII) and Pakistan Studies (Grades IX-XII).
11. Time allocation for Regional Languages as a compulsory subject where applicable is at the institutions' discretion. In Sindh, at Grades I-II, students will study either Urdu or Sindhi as a compulsory subject, and from Grades III-VIII, those studying Urdu (Compulsory) may take Asan Sindhi.

GUIDELINES FOR SSC LEVEL (GRADES IX-X)

1. Elective subjects for grades IX-X having Theory and Lab will be divided as 4+2 (06 periods) and marks allocation for elective subjects (Theory & Practical) will be 80% for theory and 20% for practical for general education stream. Elective subjects (Theory and Lab) time and marks allocation will be divided as per 40% for theory and 60% for practical for technical education stream and/or skill-based elective subjects.
2. Students will appear in 05 compulsory subjects and 03 elective subjects in Science & Matric-Tech Group while in Humanities & Social Sciences Group students will appear in 06 compulsory subjects and 02 elective subjects at SSC-I and SSC-II levels respectively.
3. In cases where students want to choose subject(s) beyond those specified in the group(s), they may opt for additional subject(s) totaling 150 marks each subject after passing SSC examination from any group.
4. The additional subject(s) involving practical, a student will provide a Practical Performance Certificate to the respective Board.
5. The marks of additional subject(s) will not be part of the total marks of Secondary School Certificate (SSC) (1200). Examination board will issue a separate transcript for the additional subject(s).
6. The translation of the Holy Quran (Grade IX-X) as a separate compulsory subject will be assessed in Urdu/English.
7. Reference to context questions may be part of the paper or as per practices adopted by the provinces.
8. Passport Holders / Students not studying under Pakistan Education Boards will study Geography of Pakistan in Grade 9-10 in lieu of Urdu (Compulsory).
9. Annual Academic Calendar for Grades IX-X is 170-180 net working days in case of 05 days a week, and 210-216 net working days in case of 06 days a week.
10. Total school/college time per day may be 5.00 to 5.30 hours. Time allocation for each subject may be decided at an institutional level.
11. Academic sessions for Grades IX-X in Summer Zone will be started in the first week of April and in Winter Zone in the first week of March.
12. Summer & Winter Vacations announcements are the discretion of the administrative departments of respective educational institutions.
13. Time allocation for Regional Languages as a compulsory subject where applicable is at the institutions' discretion. In Sindh, at Grades IX-X, those studying Urdu (Compulsory) may take Asan Sindhi.

GUIDELINES FOR HSSC LEVEL (GRADES XI-XII)

1. Elective subjects (Theory and Lab) will be divided as 6+2 (08 periods) and marks allocation (Theory & Practical) will be 80% for theory and 20% for practical for the General Education stream. Elective subjects (Theory and Lab) time and marks allocation will be divided as per 40% for theory and 60% for practical for technical education stream and/or skill-based stream.
2. Students will appear in 04 compulsory subjects and 03 elective subjects in General education at HSSC-I and HSSC-II levels respectively from the specified groups i.e. Humanities & Social Sciences, Pre-Medical, Pre-Engg and General Science/Computer Science. Students will choose any 03 elective subjects from the list of elective subjects while Inter-tech group students will opt/take 02 trade specific subjects and choose any 01 subject from the list of elective subjects.
3. In cases where students want to choose subject(s) beyond those specified in the group, they may opt for additional subject(s) totaling 200 marks in each subject after passing HSSC examinations in any group. The additional subject(s) involving practical, a student will provide Practical Performance Certificate to the respective Board. For additional subject(s), the students may make personal arrangements for their study.
4. The marks of additional subject(s) will not be part of the total marks of Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) (1200). Examination board will issue a separate transcript for the additional subject(s).
5. The translation of the Holy Quran (Grade XI-XII) as a separate compulsory subject will be assessed in Urdu/English. Reference to context questions may be part of the paper or as per practice adopted by the provinces.
6. Passport Holders / Students not studying under Pakistan Education Boards will study Pakistan Culture in Grade XI-XII in lieu of Urdu (Compulsory).
7. Annual Academic Calendar for Grades XI-XII is 110 net working days in case of 05 days a week, and 150 net working days in case of 06 days a week.
8. Total school/college time per day may be 5.00 to 5.30 hours. Time allocation for each subject may be decided at an institutional level.
9. Academic sessions for Grades XI-XII in Summer & Winter zones will be started in the first week of August.
10. Summer & Winter Vacation announcements are the discretion of the administrative departments of respective educational institutions.
11. Time allocation for Regional Languages as a compulsory subject where applicable is at the institutions' discretion. In Sindh, at Grades XI-XII, those studying Urdu (Compulsory) may take Asan Sindhi.

GUIDELINES FOR ALP PRIMARY & MIDDLE

1. The translation of the Holy Quran (Grade VI-VIII) as a separate compulsory subject will be assessed in Urdu/English. Translation of Arabic (Holy Quran) to Urdu and vice versa will not be assessed. Reference to context questions may be part of the paper or as per practices adopted by the provinces.
2. Medium of instruction is optional i.e. either English or Urdu or Multilingual.
3. Basically, this program has been developed for those learners who either missed out or dropped out. If a learner achieves desired SLOs of package A/B/C before the suggested period, he/she may be promoted to the next level.

The following updations/revisions/modifications have been made in the Inclusive Scheme of Studies 2024

- i. General Mathematics for (Grade 9-10) has been allowed for the academic year 2025-26 for Humanities & Social Sciences and Matric Tech groups. Furthermore, the Curriculum for the Functional Mathematics Grade 9-10 has been developed and shall be implemented w.e.f 2026-27 for Humanities & Social Sciences and Matric-Tech group only. General Mathematics for (Grade 9-10) beyond the academic year 2025-26 will not be offered and it will be phased out gradually.
- ii. The curricula for Functional Urdu (Grade 9-12) and Functional English (Grade 9-12) will be implemented from academics session 2026-27 for Humanities & Social Sciences and Technical Stream of Education. However, for the academic session 2025 -26 English (Compulsory) (Grade 9-12), Urdu (Compulsory) (Grade 9-12) based on NCP 2022-23 will be followed at SSC level for Humanities & Social Sciences and Technical Stream of Education. However, the same analogy may be opted at HSSC level for Technical Stream only.
- iii. Beyond the session 2025-26 the curricula of Essential of Home Economics (Grade 9-10) and Outline of Home Economics (Grade 11-12) will not be offered and will be phased out gradually. For the academic year 2026-27 and onwards, the curriculum of Home Economics (Grade 9-12) (Skill based) will be followed.
- iv. The additional subject(s) may be selected from the list of elective subjects after passing the SSC OR HSSC examination. The subject(s) **Advertising, Food Processing and Preservation, Computer Hardware, Telecommunication Technology, Entrepreneurship, Computer Science, Computer Application, Marketing, Event Management, Human Resource Management, Computer Hardware, Automation & Robotics Technology** have been added as elective subjects. These subjects were initially offered for technical stream of education only.
- v. Students would be separately awarded 10 marks certificate **once** at SSC/HSSC level on imparting (Basic Literacy and Numeracy skills) to an illiterate individual under the Each One Teaches One (EOTO) initiative. The purpose of the certificate is to promote literacy in the country. Furthermore, the marks will not be included in SSC/HSSC certificate.
- vi. The minority students may select only one subject from the option of Religious Education subject(s) i.e. Bahai, Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Kalasha, Sikhism and Zoroastrianism.
- vii. The Group(s)/Subject(s)/Trade(s) mentioned in the Scheme of Studies 2024 (Version-I) whose Curriculum have yet to be revised/developed, the previous curriculum of the respective Group(s)/Subject(s)/Trade(s) may be followed till the

revision/development of their curricula.

- viii. The nomenclature of subject of Computer Science & Entrepreneurship has been replaced with Computer Science (Grade 9-12).
- ix. The contents of Ethics subject (previously developed on the old curriculum) offered for minorities in lieu of Translation of Holy Quran have been bifurcated for Grade XI and Grade XII respectively. The bifurcated contents for each grade are available on the web site(s) of FBISE and NCC. Furthermore, the old/previous curriculum 2007 for Ethics (Grade III -XII) will be followed till the revision of the curriculum.
- x. The translation of the Holy Quran (Grade VI - XII) is a separate compulsory subject and may be assessed in Urdu/English.
